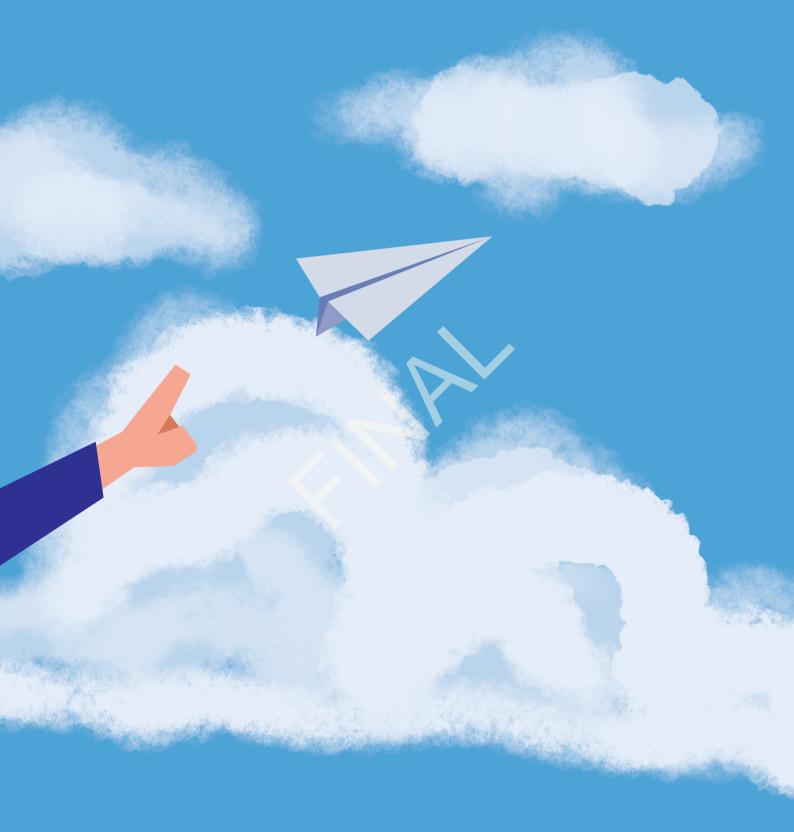
Note to parents / guardians

Did you arrive in Europe from another country? Is your family now returning home or leaving for another country? If so, then this book can help your children.

This move will be a big change for your children. Some parts of it might be difficult. We know that as a parent or guardian you want the best for your children and that you might be worried for their wellbeing during return. Fortunately, there are things you can do to make moving easier for your children. Often, children do better when they can prepare themselves for the move. If your children are too young to read this book on their own, you can help them and complete the suggested activities together. Be sure to explain the information in language they can understand and encourage them to ask questions and share how they feel. If they are older and can work in the book on their own, you can ask them about what they wrote, listen to how they are feeling and answer any questions they have.

This book is written for children 4-11 years.

If your children ask you questions about the return you do not know the answers to, please ask authorities. Also, remember that children do well when their family is doing well. Be sure to take care of yourself, so that you can take care of your children.
