

The above analysis is based on the entries made by the competent cantonal authorities in the ZEMIS database. A person can only apply for a work permit after they receive a letter from SEM confirming their S protection status. The cantonal authorities only record a work permit in the database after they have issued an S permit. This means that the actual number of work permits issued is higher than the figures shown here.

¹ This percentage does <u>not</u> indicate the rate of employment, but merely the proportion of persons with Protection Status 'S' who were in gainful employment on the date of reporting (all ages).

² Only the proportionally first <u>five</u> sectors are shown.

³ These are daily figures, which may deviate slightly from the historicised data at the end of the month.
